The mother-daughter relationship is also emphasized in her works. She used jazz music which is also a cultural symbol in her works. This study unveils the historical, symbolic, and thematic analysis in reference to their culture in her works through digital tools.

By employing different techniques literary text can be analyzed and This research paper is limited to the tools and examples from the text of Toni Morrison. Text mining, data visualization, topic modeling, network analysis, sentiment analysis, etc. are certain tools that can be used in order to provide an innovative approach on exploring and understanding the text and its characters. 'Text Mining' is a process of analyzing the words, phrases and patterns in an unstructured text.
